BOARD MEETING MINUTES
JULY 13, 2026 - 6:00 P.M.
BEALL CENTER**

- A. Petra Joyner called the Board Meeting to order at 6:10 P.M. Tracy Horne gave the Invocation and Petra led the Pledge of Allegiance.
- B. All Board Members were present - Petra Joyner, Wayne Coachman, Susan Moseley, Shandora Hopkins and Tracy Horne - and Mike Rogerson, Chief Clerk of Elections, was also present. A quorum was set, and three (3) votes will be needed to pass any motion.
- C. The minutes from June 8, 2026, meeting were read by Susan Moseley. Shandora Hopkins made a motion to accept the minutes as read - the motion was seconded by Tracy Horne, and the motion passed unanimously.
- D. Unfinished Business:
 - a. Emergency Management Services and Law Enforcement will attend the August 10th meeting to discuss activities that might cause interruptions to our local elections. The meeting will be in the Beall Center.
 - b. New signage has gone up in the County announcing our revised meeting time.
 - c. Petra will meet with the County Manager to discuss the Elections Office having a credit card.
- E. New Business:
 - a. Precinct Changes: Steam Mill is the top priority - several options were discussed and the Board is encouraged to begin attending County Commissioners meetings to bring attention to the importance of moving forward with this before the 2028 Election cycle.
 - b. Mike Rogerson gave the Clerk and Supervisor's monthly reports. A discussion on creating an Elections Office Facebook page was discussed. This will hopefully help increase public awareness of upcoming elections, provide candidate information, post AIP totals, and advertise for pollworkers. Petra Joyner made a motion to explore the possibility of creating this resource, Tracy Horne seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.
 - c. Mike Rogerson will bring the Board's "Public Comment" form to each meeting.
